NEWSLETTER

We are in the process of changing to 'electronic publishing' of the club's monthly newsletter. The newsletter will now be posted on the website for review or download and printing by each club member. This is being done to reduce the cost of publishing and postage. A sample newsletter has been posted on the website at this time with a link to download the needed Adobe Acrobat 4.0 reader. Don Vetter asked that we all attempt to download the newsletter and report any problems that may be experienced. Note that the newsletter may take a long time to load depending on computer speed, memory, internet connection etc. Next month's newsletter may be the last one distributed to the entire membership by the post office. As of next year anyone wishing to receive the newsletter by mail will be asked to pay an additional charge above the amount of the dues to handle the copying and mailing cost. The actual fee is still to be determined. No charge will be assessed this year to those wanting the mailed newsletter, but we are all encouraged to go electric to help the club save money. MINUTES OF BOARD MEETING FEBRUARY 6, 2003**Gary Sober, Secretary**

A meeting of the BASS board of directors was held at 5:30 at the St James Academy in Monkton prior to the regular club meeting. In attendance were Don Vetter, Al Derenzis, Erich Schlitzkus, Gary Sober, Tony Guide, Kevin Sharbonda, and Randy Kleinert.

A discussion of the payment of the insurance premiums for the BASS fields was first on the agenda. Only the Polo Field and Villa Maria will be covered this year. No insurance will be obtained for Walkersville. Cost is \$60.00 per field.

ECHLC

A revision of the entry fee will be needed to offset the larger amount which will need to be paid to the ESL for each entrant. The ESL fee has increased from \$.75 per flyer / day to \$2.00 per flyer / day. It was decided to raise the entry fee by \$2.00 per day. The entry fee will go up from \$15.00 per day to \$17.00 per day and a two day pre paid discount rate will be \$28.00, up from \$26.00.

Kevin will revise the entry form on the website to reflect the new rates.

We will go ahead and notify other clubs that usually send participants such as CASA, BARCSS, CRRC etc. In addition an e-mail flyer will be sent to the ESL and other appropriate publications and taken to the WRAMS and other shows.

o save some money we will not produce and give out t-shirts or hats this year. The club treasury cannot support the expenditure at this time. We discussed making buttons or stickers this year.

Many of our sources for raffle and door prize items have opted not to donate. We need to get moving on collecting stuff ASAP.

Erich suggested raffle money collected this year would be used to purchase items for next year to make the raffle self supporting.

Contest format will remain the same since ESL points are awarded and the format must conform to the ESL requirements.

NEWSLETTER

A discussion was conducted regarding conversion to an electronic newsletter to be placed on the web site in lieu of copied and mailed. A sample is on the website now as a .pdf file which can be viewed using Adobe Acrobat Reader 4.0. A link on the site allows you to download Acrobat.

Currently the newsletter costs \$1.17 (10 page) each to print and mail. A 12 page newsletter costs \$1.25 each.

In addition we currently send out 25 newsletters to non-members, clubs, LTRC, Polo Club, Stella Maris, hobby shops, vendors, etc. A list of these 25 recipients was reviewed and many were deemed of limited value.

Some of the recipients should still continue to receive the newsletter in any case.

It was decided that beginning next year, 2004, an additional fee, covering the cost of printing and postage, will be attached to the dues if you wish to receive a printed and mailed newsletter. Everyone will be asked to notify Randy Kleinert and let him know if you will accept an e-version of the newsletter by February 27, 2003.

We need 2 new 12v deep cycle batteries for the club winches. The cost will be \$80 - \$90 each. Retrievers also need new line.

We need to do a better job of coordination to make sure equipment gets to all the club contests. We had some Sovereign events where we did not have a retriever, which slowed things down considerably.



RULES & REGULATIONS

1. Athletic facilities and diamonds are not to be used when wet or muddy conditions are such that fields or diamonds might suffer any type of damage. Damage to fields will result in permit revocation. Do not remove mud or sweep water from the diamonds.
2. Adequate supervision must be provided by the user to insure good order and protection of property. Program organizers must assume liability for any damage.
3. **BALTIMORE COUNTY CODE 18-2**
 - (A) It shall be unlawful for any person to consume any alcoholic beverages on any public property, or property used by the public in general.
 - (B) It shall be unlawful for any person to have in his or her possession any alcoholic beverages in an opened container on any public property or property used by the public in general.
 - (c) Any person violating the provisions of this section shall be deemed guilty of a misdemeanor, and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to a fine not to exceed one hundred dollars, or imprisonment for not more than thirty days, or both, at the discretion of the court.
4. Sites are not to be used for personal financial gain to any individual or group of individuals.
5. Teams are requested to leave athletic fields in clean and orderly condition.
6. No bottles are to be brought on or near athletic facilities.
7. No motor vehicles of any sort are to be driven onto school grounds.
8. Permission for the use of facilities can be withdrawn immediately for any rule infraction or by giving the group advanced notification.



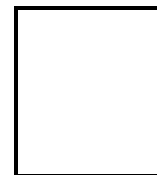
